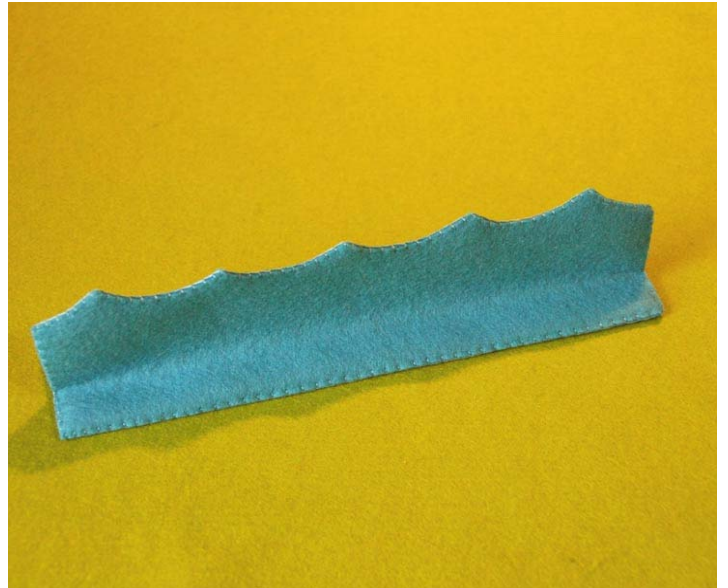
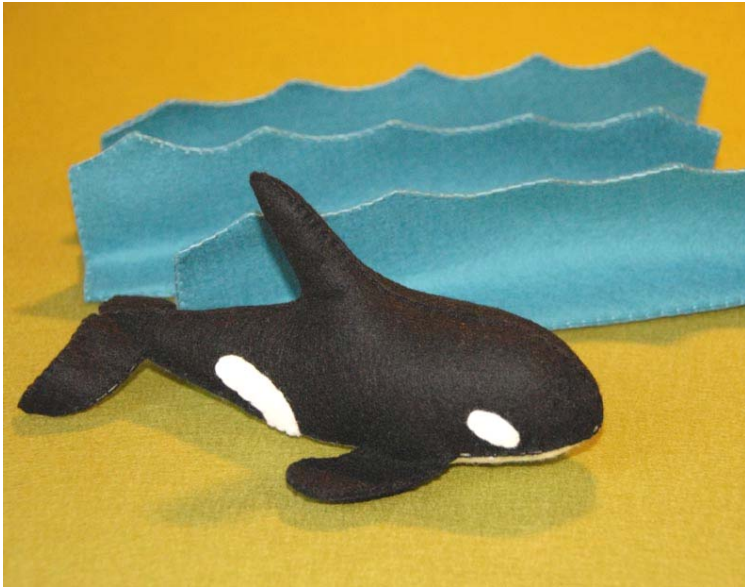


# FELT WAVES PATTERN

~ make movable waves for play or decoration~

Make some waves to go with your whales, other beach scenes and aquatic life. Made individually they can be placed together or apart. Quite simple to make and lots of fun to decorate with. Children love the open-ended aspect of the waves and will have a lot of hours of playtime with these.



*What you will need for 1 wave:*

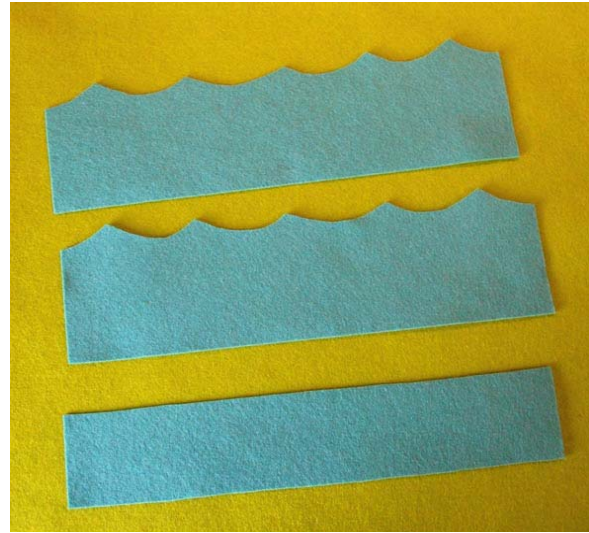
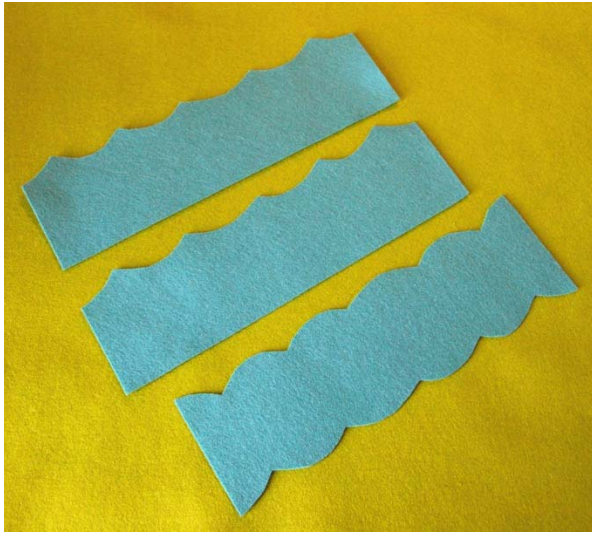
- Wool felt: 1 piece blue 20 x 25 cm (8 x 10").
- A piece of carton for the bottom, a clean pizza box strip works great. If you want your waves to stand completely upright (no bending) you'll need another piece to put in between the waves.
- Embroidery floss in matching blue.
- Needles, pins, scissors.

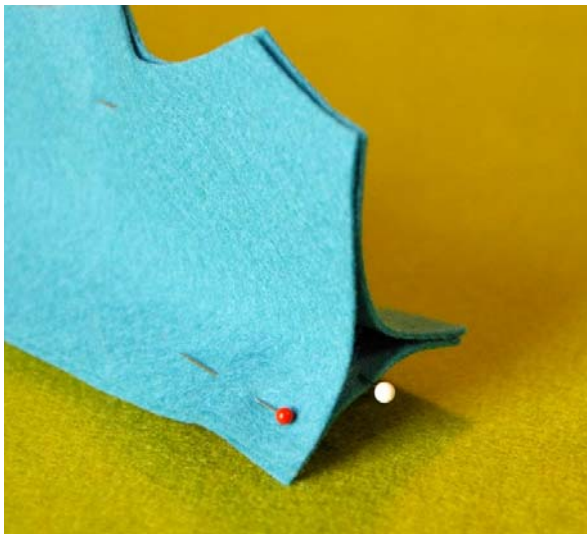
# FELT WAVES PATTERN

**General:** Please read the instructions thoroughly before beginning. Cut out pattern pieces (note, there are 2 wave pattern options), without a seam allowance. Make sure all pieces fit on felt, before cutting. Use two strands of embroidery floss for blanket stitches.

## Make a wave:

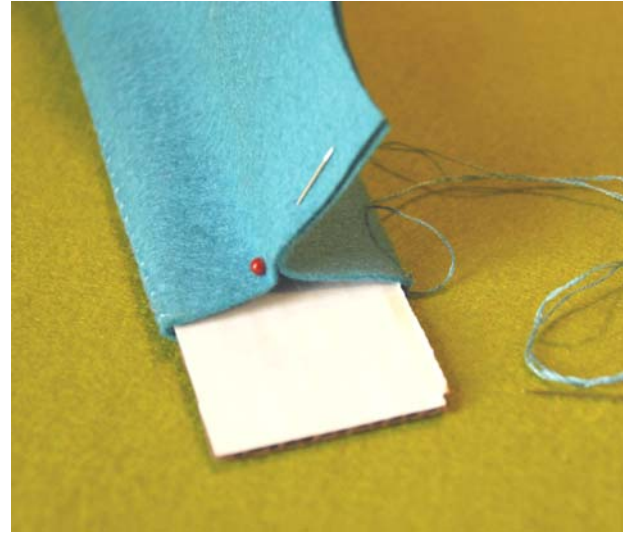
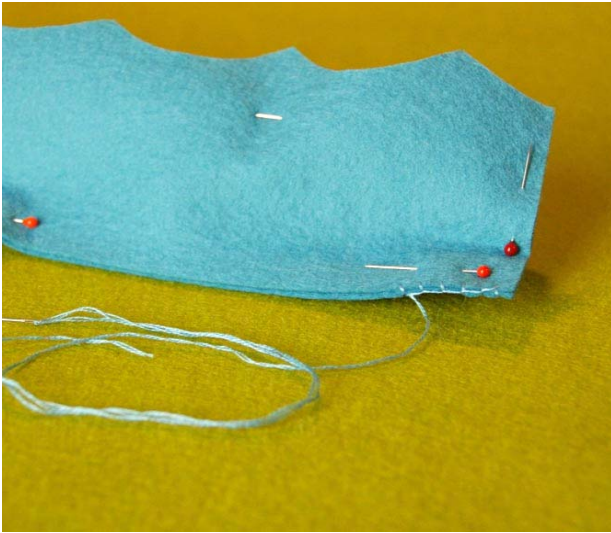


1. Cut out wave pattern. You will have two identical waves plus be left with a piece that is scalloped on both sides.
2. Trim the scallops off so you are left with a long rectangle (see above bottom right).



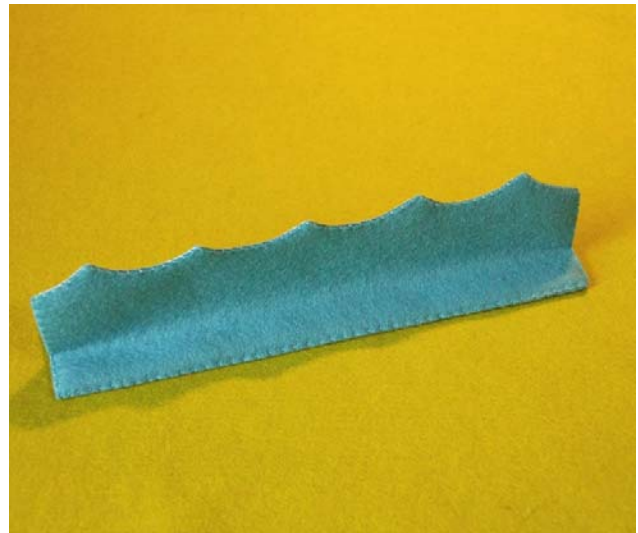
3. Pin and trim waves, making sure the waves match at the top. Trim to match if necessary. Then pin the bottom piece on in between along the straight edges, matching at corners.
4. Now pin the waves where they meet the centre of the bottom piece. That way you will have equal amounts of bottom (facing upward) on both sides of the wave.





**5.** Blanket stitch the length of the wave on the bottom along the long side, across the short side when you get to the end of the first length and back up the other length (opposite side). Leave one end open.

**6.** Cut a piece of cardboard (ie: clean pizza box) slightly smaller than the felt rectangle of your wave bottom. Slide it in the open end (last short side). Stitch end closed.



**7.** Blanket stitch an end of the wave closed, beginning at the base. Continue along the top of the waves and finish off the other end.

**8.** Finished!! Your wave is done. Make some more!! Maybe try other blue tones, or any other colour you like.

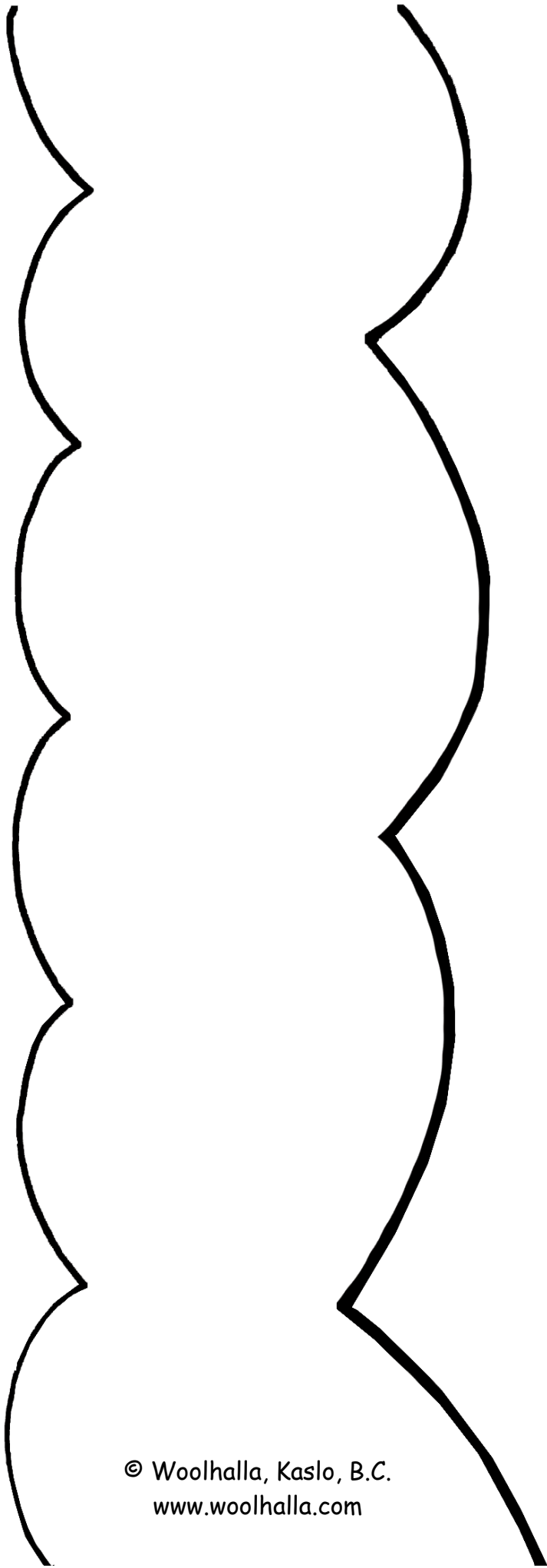
